This class will explore the ancient Near Eastern literary environment of the Old Testament texts. From the story of the discovery of the ancient Mesopotamian world to the decipherment of cuneiform writing and the content of the texts, we will chart the impact that these discoveries had on the study of the Bible. We will take an in-depth look at texts such as the Gilgamesh Epic and ancient Sumerian and Babylonian creation myths, discuss the themes that these texts have in common with the Biblical texts, and also how they differ.

PUBLIC ART PROJECTS SINCE WORLD WAR II

In 2006 Public Art Review ranked Wichita State University's Martin H. Bush Outdoor Sculpture Collection one of the top ten campus art collections. In 2008 this impressive body of public art expanded with the addition of Tom Otterness's whimsical bronze Millipede. This spring, the Ulrich enlivens the campus yet again with a temporary installation by internationally recognized contemporary artist Tony Feher.

In this short course, Emily Stamey, Ulrich curator of modern and contemporary art, will place Feher's project, and many of the Ulrich's permanent outdoor artworks, in the context of key modern and contemporary trajectories in public art has evolved beyond traditional monuments and murals. 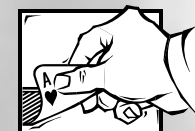
