

SENATE BILL: S098-03162005

TITLE: The Developmental Math Scholarship

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate of the University that the following statute shall govern the establishment and operation of the Association's Developmental Math Scholarship, herein after referred to as the Scholarship.

Section 1. Purpose of the Scholarship

- 1.1 The intent of the Scholarship shall be to provide approximately one half (1/2) the cost of tuition for developmental math courses (MATH 011, MATH 012, MATH 013) at the University.
- 1.2 The Scholarship is provided as an incentive for students to begin their higher education endeavors at the University.
- 1.3 The Scholarship shall assist students with financial need as these courses do not count as credit toward graduation.

Section 2. Funding

- 2.1 The Scholarship monies shall be received from the Educational Opportunity Fund. This amount shall be determined by the Educational Opportunity Fund Committee.
- 2.2 All funds available for a fiscal year are to be awarded for that fiscal year, with any unused, unallocated, or forfeited money being rolled over into the Educational Opportunity Fund reserve account.

Section 3. Allocation

- 3.1 The Office of Financial Aid of the University will select recipients and make the awards.
- 3.2 The Scholarship shall be awarded in ten (10) scholarships.
 - 3.2.1 Five (5) scholarships shall be awarded for the Fall semester. Five (5) scholarships shall be awarded for the Spring semester.

Section 4. Qualifications and Requirements

- 4.1 Consideration will be given to academic merit, financial need, campus involvement, and community involvement. The Office of Financial Aid shall determine the weight each element will carry for consideration.
 - 4.1.1 Students recognized by the University as "non-traditional" who are enrolling in at least eight (8) credit hours shall be eligible for a scholarship.
 - 4.1.2 Recipients of the Scholarship must continue their enrollment at the University.
 - 4.1.3 In the event of a "Drop," scholarship monies shall be returned to the Association.
- 4.2 Students may only receive this scholarship once.
